My research sits at the intersection of public finance, tax policy, and social policy, with a sustained focus on how fiscal and administrative design shapes equity, access, and well-being in Canada. I am committed to producing work that makes both an academic contribution and a tangible impact on Canadian policymaking and policy implementation — work that is rigorous enough to advance scholarly debate and accessible enough to inform the people who design, deliver, and are affected by public policy.

I pursue this through a range of outlets and approaches: peer-reviewed journals across economics, law, and public administration; technical reports and policy papers for decision makers; strategic research partnerships with governments and community organizations; and knowledge-mobilization efforts aimed at practitioners and the public. I also develop and maintain open digital research infrastructure — including INCLUSIECON ([inclusiecon.ca](http://inclusiecon.ca)), a public-facing research hub designed to make evidence on inclusive economic policy accessible beyond the academic community. I am a regular non-partisan public commentator, appearing in print media, on television, radio, and podcasts, and providing expert testimony before parliamentary and legislative committees.
